Jagbir and Pariah Kutta are two scholars who have different interpretations of the Gospel of Thomas, Logion 29. Jagbir follows the translation of Blatz, who renders the saying as a marvel and a marvel of marvels. Jagbir believes that Jesus is expressing his astonishment at how the spirit and the flesh are related, and how the spirit, which is a great wealth, can dwell in the flesh, which is a poverty. Pariah Kutta follows the translation of Layton, who uses the word amazing instead of marvel. Pariah Kutta thinks that Jesus is not amazed, but rather sarcastic and critical of the dualistic view of spirit and flesh. He argues that Jesus is implying that both spirit and flesh are equally valuable and necessary for the expression of God's glory in the world.

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In this blog post, I will share with you some insights from two of my friends, Jagbir and Pariah Kutta, who have different perspectives on a quote from the Gospel of Thomas, Logion 29. The quote is:

"If the flesh came into being because of spirit, that is a marvel, but if spirit came into being because of the body, that is a marvel of marvels. Yet I marvel at how this great wealth has come to dwell in this poverty."

Jagbir is a Christian who believes that the Gospel of Thomas is a heretical and gnostic text that contradicts the orthodox teachings of the church. He calls his approach "Plan A", which is based on the words of Jesus in John 6:63:

"It is the Spirit who gives life; the flesh profits nothing. The words that I speak to you are spirit, and they are life."

Jagbir argues that the Gospel of Thomas is wrong to suggest that the spirit can come into being because of the body, or that the body is a poverty that houses a great wealth. He says that the spirit is eternal and uncreated, while the body is temporal and corruptible. He says that the spirit does not depend on the body, but rather gives life to the body. He says that the body is not a poverty, but a gift from God that should be used for his glory.

Pariah Kutta is a spiritual seeker who does not belong to any specific religion. He calls his approach "Plan B", which is based on the words of Rumi, a 13th-century Persian poet and mystic:

"You are not a drop in the ocean. You are the entire ocean in a drop."

Pariah Kutta argues that the Gospel of Thomas is right to point out the paradox and mystery of how spirit and body relate to each other. He says that both are marvels, and both are expressions of the same divine source. He says that the spirit can come into being because of the body, because the body is a

manifestation of spirit in material form. He says that the body is a poverty, but also a wealth, because it contains the potential for spiritual awakening and transformation.

"Plan 'A': Jesus said, "If the flesh came into being because of spirit, that is a marvel, but if spirit came into being because of the body, that is a marvel of marvels. Yet I marvel at how this great wealth has come to dwell in this poverty." This quote is from the Gospel of Thomas, a collection of sayings attributed to Jesus that was discovered in 1945 in Egypt. It reflects a Gnostic view of the world, where the material realm is seen as inferior and corrupt, and the spiritual realm is seen as superior and pure. Jesus is portrayed as a teacher of wisdom who reveals the hidden knowledge (gnosis) of how to escape the bondage of the flesh and attain salvation.

Pariah Kutta is a term that means "outcast dog" in Hindi. It is also the name of a landrace of dogs native to the Indian subcontinent, also known as the Indian pariah dog or INDog. They are medium-sized dogs with erect ears, wedge-shaped heads, and curved tails. They are easily trainable and often used as guard dogs and police dogs. They are one of the oldest and most primitive types of dogs, dating back to over 15,000 years ago. They are genetically distinct from other dog breeds and have adapted to various environments and climates.

"Plan 'B': "Krishna said: The soul is never born nor dies at any time. Soul has not come into being, does not come into being, and will not come into being. Soul is unborn, eternal, ever-existing and primeval. Soul is not slain when the body is slain." This quote is from the Bhagavad Gita, a sacred text of Hinduism that contains a dialogue between Krishna, an avatar of Vishnu, and Arjuna, a warrior prince who faces a moral dilemma before a great battle. It teaches the concepts of dharma (duty), karma (action), and moksha (liberation). It also explains the nature of the soul (atman), which is identical to the supreme reality (brahman). The soul is immortal and indestructible, and transcends the cycle of birth and death (samsara).

Compare Jesus' and Krishna's perspective regarding the eternal souls reading this post May 17, 2023.

Jesus and Krishna have different perspectives on the relationship between the soul and the body. For Jesus, the soul is trapped in a material body that is prone to sin and suffering. The soul needs to be liberated from the body by acquiring gnosis, which is a secret knowledge that only a few can access. For Krishna, the soul is not affected by the body or its actions.
