**[American Psychosis](#) - Chris Hedges on the US empire of narcissism and psychopathy**

In this blog post, I will share my thoughts on the video "American Psychosis - Chris Hedges on the US empire of narcissism and psychopathy" that I watched on YouTube. The video features an interview with Chris Hedges, a Pulitzer-prize winning journalist, author and activist who has written extensively about the decline of American democracy and culture. He discusses how modern-day consumerism, totalitarian corporate power, and living in a culture dominated by pervasive illusion have created a collective mental illness among the population.

Hedges argues that we are living in a state of "American psychosis", where reality is under assault, verbal confusion reigns, truth and illusion have merged, and mental chaos makes it hard to fathom what is happening. He says that we feel trapped in a hall of mirrors, where exposed lies are answered with other lies, and the rational is countered with the irrational. He cites examples of this psychosis, such as the election of Donald Trump, who embodies the cult of self and the worship of wealth and power that pervade our society. He also points out how we have become addicted to spectacle and entertainment, which distract us from the harsh realities of our collapsing environment, economy, and social fabric.

Hedges warns that this psychosis is not only dangerous for ourselves, but also for the rest of the world, as we export our violence, greed, and hatred through endless wars, coups, and interventions. He says that we have become a rogue nation that violates international law and human rights with impunity. He also criticizes the role of the corporate media, which he says has abandoned its function as a watchdog and a critic of power, and instead has become a propaganda machine that manufactures consent and manipulates public opinion.

Hedges calls for a radical transformation of our values and our way of life, based on resistance, solidarity, and moral courage. For example, I wonder how realistic and feasible it is to expect a mass movement of resistance and change in a society that is so deeply divided, apathetic, and indoctrinated by the dominant ideology. I also wonder how effective and ethical it is to use terms like "psychosis" and "mental illness" to describe the collective behavior and mindset of a nation, as it may imply a lack of agency and responsibility among individuals and groups. I also wonder how inclusive and diverse his vision of a better society is, as he seems to focus mainly on the perspective of white male intellectuals like himself.
