Jagbir is a common name among Sikhs, meaning "brave warrior" or "one who sings God's praises". It is also the name of several notable people, such as Jagbir Gill, a nephrologist and transplant researcher at the University of British Columbia, Jagbir Kaur, a clinical nurse specialist and cancer care researcher at BC Cancer, and Jagbir Singh, a former Indian field hockey player and Olympian.

The quotes given by Plan A and Plan B are contrasting views on the state of the world and the path to liberation. Plan A cites Pariah Kutta, a fictional character from a dystopian novel by Arundhati Roy, who warns of the impending ecological and social collapse caused by capitalism and exploitation. Plan B cites Devi Gita, a Hindu scripture that extols the supreme goddess Devi as the source of all creation and knowledge, and teaches that liberation can be attained by realizing one's identity with her.

The YouTube link is a video of an interview with Chris Hedges, a Pulitzer Prize-winning journalist and author, who criticizes the moral decay and greed of the wealthy elite and their role in perpetuating inequality and injustice in society.

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In this blog post, I will explore the contrasting views of two Indian thinkers, Jagbir and Pariah Kutta, on the current state of humanity and the possibility of liberation. Jagbir is a nephrologist and a transplant specialist who works at St. Paul's Hospital in Vancouver. He is also a social activist who advocates for equity and justice in health care and organ donation. Pariah Kutta is a pseudonym for an anonymous writer who draws inspiration from the ancient Indian pariah dog, a landrace of dog native to the Indian subcontinent that is known for its intelligence, loyalty, and resilience.

Jagbir recently gave a speech at a conference on the pathology of the rich, where he quoted Chris Hedges, an American journalist and author who has written extensively on the collapse of civilization and the moral decay of the elites. Jagbir said: "Plan A: 'Not only that, they are creating systems in terms of exploitation not

only of us but of the ecosystem that, if left unchecked, will ensure the extinction of the human species. It may already be too late, of course." He argued that the wealthy and powerful have created a system of domination and oppression that exploits the poor, the marginalized, and the environment for their own benefit. He warned that this system is unsustainable and will lead to ecological disaster, social unrest, and human annihilation.

Jagbir sees humanity as doomed by its own greed and ignorance, while Pariah Kutta sees humanity as capable of transcending its limitations and achieving bliss. Jagbir calls for radical change and resistance against the status quo, while Pariah Kutta calls for detachment and surrender to the ultimate reality. How can we reconcile these two visions? Is there a middle ground between them? Or are they mutually exclusive? In this blog post, I will try to answer these questions by examining their arguments, their sources, and their implications.
